Laurie Victor Kay invites the viewer to escape through her work. Her visual language creates a psychological entrance into idealized and unique spaces. Influenced by her background in painting, she injects super-real hues and re-imagines places following a mathematical rhythm and perfectionist eye. Digitally manipulating the image allows her to construct energized spaces. The images photographed in-camera are simply a preface and function as the architecture for Laurie's finalized works. Her work confronts conceptual opposites and plays with perspective. At once, lines on the blue concrete in her work "Football II Bangkok" become a framework, and the urban soccer players transform into vibrant abstractions. In the "Kaleidoscope" series, Paris' dark subways are juxtaposed against saturated color and lightness, and symmetry is found in chaos. Laurie's large-scale photographs are inspired by travel where she continually discovers strange and poetic beauty in unexpected places.

Laurie Victor Kay studied at the School of the Art Institute of Chicago and Columbia College in Chicago where she received her B.F.A. in photography in 1995. She is the past winner of the Prix de la Photographie. In the summer of 2015, Laurie's work was presented at Art Seen, a juried exhibition at the Joslyn Art Museum. Her work has been featured in Photo District news and she is a selected artist for the Brussels Accessible Art Fair in New York City in the fall of 2016. Through her recent collaboration with the Jim Thompson Thai Silk Company, Laurie has also blurred the lines between art, fashion, and photography to design and produce three limited edition silk scarves. Galleries in Chicago and Sun Valley represent Laurie's fine art. Her works are in numerous private collections throughout the United States. Laurie owns Laurie and Charles Photographs in Omaha, Nebraska. Her commercial clients include the Tiger Woods Foundation, Nike, Proctor and Gamble, AT&T, the New York Times, Condé Nast Traveler, and Travel and Leisure, among many others.
